DELAC Minutes for 5-26-16:

Principals, Vice principals, DELAC representatives and other members arrived to the meeting before 11:45 a.m., and everyone was invited to enjoy a quick lunch. Superintendent Dr. Kamberg called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. Dr. Kamberg welcome everyone and started the meeting by asking all the participants to share anything good in their life. Dr. Lollis, principal from BMS, shared that this year there are going to be 11 valedictorian students from her site. Also, Dr. Kamberg wanted to update all the members about the goals that the district has implemented from LCAP. The district is focusing on student achievement, engagement, and parent involvement. At the same time Dr. Kamberg asked the principals to stand by their posters, which are their site LCAP single school plan, and give an update.

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After the principals were done with their updates, the rest of the participants had the opportunity to write their questions and stick them on the posters. Every principal shared their posters information one by one principal from BES, Mr. McGlasson started by saying that at their site attendance and parent involvement has to be improved and that technology continues to grow, not fast but consistent. Mr. Baxter, principal from WRB, shared that at his site they are using LCAP money to run intervention with two aides and for next school year they will be able to contract a teacher to lead the program. Mr. Baxter is very pleased to share that attendance has grown and improve! Over 35 ELD students at WRB moved to proficient level and parent involvement has improved too. Dr. Herrera, principal at SCCA, talked about their goal at SCCA which is to have 100% of the students graduating from high school. Other information provided by Dr. Herrera was that at SCCA 100% of the students has a device at home to be prepared for the university. At SCCA 68% of the students have a college experience and their attendance has improved. Mr. Hayes, principal from OG, shared that, at OG their attendance has improved as well as their suspensions. They went from 45 to 15 suspensions this school year. The parent involvement at OG has shown, Mr. Hayes agreed that thanks to the parent involvement OG students were able to have some field trips, including one to Sacramento and one to Santa Barbara. Mr. McCracken, principal from BHA, shared that at BHA their number one goal is to continue the improvement of their student's achievement. Also, at BHA the LCAP money was used to buy books and their goal number two is to increase parent and community involvement. Their goal number three is to provide to the students a centered of education. The principal from SCA-M Mrs. Shimer shared her LCAP information from her site and at SCA-M intervention is been provided for both English and Spanish with Lexia. Also, their attendance has improved and the involvement of parents has been great. Mrs. Weisenberger, principal at SCA-L, shared that at SCA-L they have a safe environment and this year they try to measure the 30 hours donation from the families and noticed that 59% of the families have completed the 30 volunteer hours. Attendance has improved as well as their academic achievement. At SCA-L with the LCAP money they bought iPads and the intervention students are receiving services. The principal from JMA, Mrs. Styles, shared that students and parents at JMA feel secure and safe. Mrs. Styles added that at JMA they keep implementing the capturing kid's hearts method to continue growing. The parent involvement keeps growing as well, due to the events and clubs provided at JMA. At the end the principal from BMS Dr. Lollis, conclude by sharing her poster information and by stating that at BMS the intervention and Saturday classes didn't work due to the lack of the student's participation. Dr. Lollis shared that their attendance increases 1%. And at BMS there is no parent involvement. Dr. Kamberg asked Mrs. Wendy Jones to provide her information and she started by saying that LCAP has its designated money and that budgets are fluent. Also, Mrs. Jones shared that there's one and a half million dollars in LCAP for next year. Mrs. Jones added that this was the first time that sites get the LCAP money to use for with their needs, but if they don't use it at their sites they have to return it back. Dr. Kamberg thanked everyone for their attendance, and the meeting was adjourned at 1:45 p.m.

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
